- **Protection:** If the tray has sharp edges at the side entry, use edge protectors or grommets to prevent abrasion .
- **Tray Type:** Ladder, ventilated, or solid-bottom trays can all accommodate side entry, but the choice affects ventilation, heat dissipation, and mechanical protection .
