- **Fiber Converters:** To safely connect single-mode and multimode fibers, a single-mode/multimode fiber converter is required. These devices adapt the light signal from one fiber type to the other, reducing signal loss and enabling communication between different fiber types.
- **Consistent Fiber Deployment:** Ideally, networks should use consistent fiber types throughout a link. If a single-mode connection is needed, laying new single-mode fiber is recommended rather than attempting to mix fiber types.
