

Distance between heat pipe and cable tray



Summary of Content

The minimum recommended distance between a cable tray and a heat pipe is 500 mm with insulation, and at least 1000 mm if no insulation is present.

Recommended Spacing

When installing cable trays near heat pipes, proper spacing is essential to prevent heat damage to cables and ensure safe operation:

- **Parallel Installation:** The cable tray should be installed at a minimum distance of 500 mm from a heat pipe if the pipe has an insulation layer. If the heat pipe is uninsulated, the distance should be at least 1000 mm to reduce the risk of heat transfer to the cables .
- **Overhead or Upper Heat Pipes:** If the cable tray must be installed beneath a heat pipe, the distance should not be less than 1000 mm, and effective heat insulation measures should be applied to protect the cables .
- **Insulation Considerations:** The thickness of the insulation layer on the heat pipe should be taken into account. A thicker insulation layer can allow the cable tray to be positioned closer, but the minimum recommended spacing of 500 mm should still be maintained .

- **Thermal Effects:** Heat from pipes can degrade cable insulation, reduce cable lifespan, or cause electrical failures. Maintaining proper spacing ensures cables remain within safe operating temperatures .
