Composition of Fiber Optic Cables

Pure fiber optic cables are built around a core made of ultra-pure glass or plastic, which carries data as pulses of light rather than electrical signals. Surrounding the core is a cladding layer with a lower refractive index that reflects light back into the core, a buffer coating to protect the fragile fiber, and an outer jacket made of polyethylene or PVC for mechanical protection and environmental resistance. These cables do not conduct electricity, making them immune to electromagnetic interference and safer in electrically sensitive environments .

Why Fiber Optics Avoid Copper

The absence of copper in standard fiber optic cables provides several advantages:

- High bandwidth and speed: Light signals travel at nearly the speed of light, allowing much higher data rates than copper wires .
- Long-distance transmission: Fiber can carry signals over kilometers without significant loss, unlike copper which suffers from attenuation .
- Electrical isolation: No risk of ground loops, sparks, or electrical hazards .
- Resistance to interference: Immune to electromagnetic interference, unlike copper cables .
