Core and Cladding Materials

Some cables include strength members like aramid yarn or steel rods to provide tensile strength, but these are not part of the light-carrying medium .

Metallic Components

While most fiber optic cables are all-dielectric (containing no metal), certain specialized cables may include metallic elements for grounding, power, or chemical protection. These metallic parts are optional and do not replace the core fiber; they are not made of aluminum by default and are used only for structural or functional purposes
