Summary of Content

An electrical distribution box facing an entrance must have at least 36 inches (3 ft) of clear working space in front, 30 inches wide, and 78 inches high to comply with NEC safety standards.

Working Space Requirements

When a distribution box or panelboard is installed on a wall facing an entrance, the National Electrical Code (NEC) mandates a clear working space to allow safe access for operation, maintenance, and emergency egress. Key requirements include:

- **Depth of Clearance:** For panels up to 600V, the minimum depth in front of the panel is 36 inches (914 mm) if facing a non-electrical wall. If the panel faces a grounded surface such as concrete or brick, the depth increases to 42 inches, and if facing another panel or electrical equipment, it must be 48 inches to account for potential simultaneous servicing and increased shock risk .
- **Width of Clearance:** The working space must be at least 30 inches (762 mm) wide or the width of the panel, whichever is greater. The panel does not need to be centered within this width; it can be offset as long as the total clear width is maintained .
- **Height of Clearance:** A vertical clearance of at least 78 inches (6' 6") from the floor to any obstruction is required. The highest breaker handle must not exceed 79 inches (6' 7") above the finished floor to ensure accessibility without a ladder .
