

Fiber Optic Cable Identification

Fiber optic cables can be identified by their core type, jacket color, connector type, and print legend markings, following industry standards like TIA-598-D and TIA-606-B.

Core Type and Mode

Fiber optic cables are primarily classified as single-mode (SM) or multimode (MM). Single-mode fibers have a 9 μm core and are typically used for long-distance, high-speed transmission, while multimode fibers have larger cores, such as 50/125 μm or 62.5/125 μm , suitable for shorter distances and local networks. The core and cladding sizes are often printed on the cable jacket, e.g., "50/125 OM3" indicates a multimode OM3 fiber with a 50 μm core and 125 μm cladding.

Jacket Color Coding

The outer jacket color provides a quick visual cue for the fiber type:

- Yellow: Single-mode fiber
- Orange: Multimode OM1 or OM2
- Aqua: Multimode OM3 or OM4
- Other colors may be used for specialized fibers or as indicated by the manufacturer.
