

Fiber Optic Cable Wavelength and Power



Overview

Fiber wavelengths used in telecommunications range from 770nm to 1675nm, but you focus on 1310nm and 1550nm because they offer the best combination of low attenuation and manageable dispersion. The 1310nm wavelength is suitable for medium distances and both multimode and single-mode. Fiber optic transmission wavelengths are determined by two factors: longer wavelengths in the infrared for lower loss in the glass fiber and at wavelengths which are between the absorption bands. Thus the normal wavelengths are 850, 1300 and 1550 nm. For companies that specialize in OEM or contract manufacturing of fiber and cable assemblies, mastering the. While optical power meters are the primary power measurement instrument, optical loss test sets (OLTSS) and optical time domain reflectometers (OTDRs) also measure power in testing loss.
