Fiber optic cable brings ultra-fast internet directly into your home, typically via an Optical Network Terminal (ONT) connected to your router.

Professional Installation

When you order a full-fiber broadband service, an engineer will bring the fiber optic cable from the nearest network point—either underground or via an overhead pole—directly to your property . The cable enters your home through a small drilled hole, usually about 10mm, and is connected to an Optical Network Terminal (ONT). The ONT converts the light signals from the fiber into data your router can use, enabling high-speed internet throughout your home . Installation typically takes 2–4 hours, depending on property layout and any additional work required .

Internal Fiber Routing

Inside the house, fiber can be extended from the ONT to a centralized location, such as a media closet or network rack, to optimize performance and aesthetics . Key considerations include:

- Pathway planning: Choose the shortest, straightest route to minimize bends and stress on the fiber, avoiding areas with high heat, foot traffic, or sharp edges .
- Cable type: Residential installations usually use single-mode fiber with pre-terminated connectors (SC/APC or LC) to simplify setup .
- Protection: Use flexible low-voltage conduit in open wall cavities or high-traffic areas to prevent damage from accidental contact or renovations .
