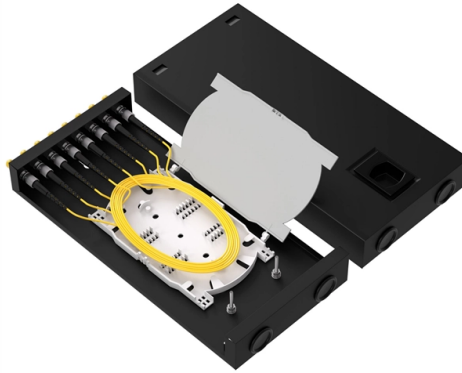


Gigabit port access to 100Mbps switch



Summary of Content

A Gigabit switch port may operate at 100 Mbps due to cable issues, device limitations, or configuration mismatches, even if the switch supports 1 Gbps.

Common Causes

1. Cable Quality and Wiring: Gigabit Ethernet requires all 8 wires in a Cat5e or higher cable to be intact and properly connected. If the cable is damaged, pinched, or uses only 4 wires (as in older 100 Mbps setups), the switch will fall back to 100 Mbps to maintain a stable connection . 2. Connected Device Limitations: If a device connected to the switch only supports 100 Mbps, the port will auto-negotiate to the maximum speed the device can handle. This includes older computers, PoE cameras, or certain network endpoints . 3. Router or Uplink Restrictions: Connecting a Gigabit switch to a router or another switch that only supports 100 Mbps ports can limit traffic passing through that device to 100 Mbps. However, devices communicating within the same Gigabit switch can still achieve full 1 Gbps speeds . 4. Speed and Duplex Settings: Incorrect NIC settings or outdated drivers can conflict with the switch's auto-negotiation, causing a duplex mismatch and limiting speeds to 100 Mbps . 5. Faulty or Low-Quality Switch Ports: Aging or low-quality switches may fail to maintain Gigabit speeds consistently, causing ports to revert to 100 Mbps .

Troubleshooting Steps

- Inspect and replace cables: Use Cat5e or Cat6 cables in good condition and ensure all 8 wires are properly terminated.
- Check device capabilities: Verify that connected devices support Gigabit speeds.
