

Grounding missing in distribution box



Summary of Content

A missing ground in a distribution box poses serious safety risks and must be corrected by installing a proper grounding connection to ensure low-resistance fault paths.

Importance of Grounding

Grounding provides a low-resistance path for electrical faults, preventing metal parts of the distribution box or connected equipment from becoming energized. Without grounding, a fault can energize the metal enclosure, creating a high risk of electric shock or fire if someone touches it while in contact with a grounded object. Proper grounding also protects sensitive electronics from damage due to voltage surges.

Proper Grounding Installation

Each distribution box must be grounded using a dedicated ground wire connected from the box to a central grounding point or earth rod. For example, in the US, a 10 AWG (5.26 mm²) wire is typically used, while other markets may require a 6 mm² wire. The connection should be made from a threaded stud on the box to the mounting plate, and then from the mounting plate to the factory or building central ground. The total ground resistance should be less than 0.1 ohm to ensure safety.

Key Steps:

- Turn off power to the distribution box before working on grounding.
- Attach a ground wire from the box's grounding stud to the mounting plate.
- Connect a second ground wire from the mounting plate to the main grounding point or earth rod.
