An electrooculogram (EOG) is a non-invasive electrophysiological test that measures the electrical potential between the cornea and retina to assess retinal function and eye movement . It is commonly used to diagnose retinal disorders such as Best's disease or to evaluate macular dysfunction . The test involves placing small electrodes around the eyes and on the forehead, recording eye movements under light and dark conditions, and usually takes about 45 minutes . Pupillary dilation is required, and patients are advised not to drive immediately afterward due to temporary blurred vision .

Cost Factors

- **Clinic Type and Location:** Specialized ophthalmology centers or hospitals may charge more than smaller clinics. Urban areas often have higher fees than rural locations.
- **Insurance Coverage:** Some health insurance plans may cover part of the cost if the test is medically necessary, while vision insurance typically does not cover specialized electrophysiological tests .
- **Additional Fees:** Costs may include the ophthalmologist's interpretation of results, facility fees, and any preparatory medications like pupil-dilating drops.
