

How much fireproof putty is needed for a light distribution box



Summary of Content

Typically, one firestop putty pad per single-gang light distribution box is required, molded to cover the back and sides with a minimum thickness of 3 mm (1/8 inch), but always follow the UL listing for your specific wall assembly.

Determining the Amount of Putty

Single-gang boxes: For standard single-gang electrical boxes, one putty pad is generally sufficient. The pad should be pressed firmly around the back and sides of the box, covering all gaps between the box and the wall cavity, including any joints with plasterboard or studs . Double-gang or larger boxes: Larger boxes may require two pads or a larger pad to ensure full coverage. Some manufacturers provide oversized pads or allow combining multiple pads to cover the entire box surface . Thickness and coverage: Most intumescent putty pads should maintain a minimum average thickness of 3 mm (1/8 inch) throughout the installation. Some UL-listed pads, like the SpecSeal SSP, are thicker (3/16 inch) to enhance fire and acoustic performance . Installation tips:

- Clean the box interior before applying the pad.
- Mold the pad to fully line the internal face of the back and sides.
- Trim excess material to sit flush with the wall surface.
