

# Is it necessary to choose an optical port for a switch

Ethernet ports support speeds up to 10G over copper cables, with a practical distance limit of around 100 meters . In these scenarios, optical ports are optional because the network does not require the extended reach or ultra-high bandwidth that fiber provides.
