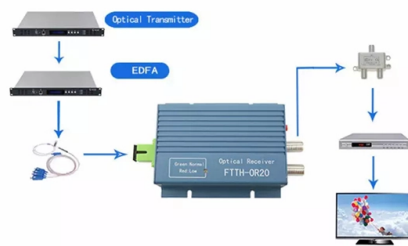


Is it necessary to use cable trays for cable routing

Cable routing is commonly done in cable trays to ensure organized, safe, and code-compliant electrical installations, but not all cables or locations require trays.

Purpose of Cable Trays

Cable trays are open or ventilated structures designed to support and route electrical conductors efficiently in industrial, commercial, and large infrastructure projects . They provide:

- Organized routing for power, control, Ethernet, and fiber optic cables.
- Easy maintenance and access for inspection, repair, or future expansion.
- Thermal management by allowing air circulation around cables, reducing overheating risks.
- Separation of high-power and low-power cables to minimize electromagnetic interference (EMI), .

When Cable Trays Are Required

While cable trays are highly recommended for installations with numerous conductors or complex routing, they are not mandatory for all cable types or locations. NEC Article 392 governs cable tray use, specifying:

- Only tray-rated cables (Type TC, MC, or approved Ethernet cables) should be installed .
