

Large bridge structure in Ireland



Overview

Nicknamed the Ha'penny Bridge, the official title of this Dublin landmark is the Liffey Bridge, named after the river the structure crosses. This table presents the structures with spans greater than 100 meters (non-exhaustive). These structures do more than just carry cars and pedestrians—many have woven their way into the fabric of Ireland's culture and history. Spanning major rivers like the River Liffey and Shannon, they not only connect cities and towns but also serve as stunning landmarks that tell tales of. The Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy Bridge is an extradosed bridge over the River Barrow in Ireland. It was built as part of the N25 New Ross Bypass, and was officially opened on 29 January 2020 by Taoiseach Leo Varadkar and opened to traffic on 30 January 2020, becoming Ireland's longest bridge.
