Role of Aggregation Switches

Aggregation switches act as an intermediary between access switches and core switches, consolidating traffic from multiple access points, servers, or edge devices and forwarding it efficiently to the core network. They operate at Layer 2 or Layer 3, supporting routing, switching, and traffic management functions. Key benefits include:

- Increased bandwidth through link aggregation
- Redundancy and failover to maintain uptime
- Simplified management by treating multiple links as a single logical connection
- Scalability for growing networks

Configuring Link Aggregation

Link aggregation combines multiple physical links into a single logical link to enhance throughput and provide redundancy. Common protocols include:

- LACP (Link Aggregation Control Protocol): Automates link aggregation setup and ensures failover if a link fails
 - Static Link Aggregation: Manually configured aggregation for predictable traffic patterns
