Purpose of Marking Lines

Marking lines on cable tray bends helps installers:

- Maintain consistent cable alignment through the bend.
- Ensure minimum bend radius is not violated, preventing cable damage.
- Facilitate accurate installation of multiple trays in series or complex layouts.

Recommended Procedure

- Measure the Bend Angle: Confirm the bend is exactly 30 degrees using a protractor or angle template.
- Identify the Centerline: Draw a centerline along the tray's path before the bend. This line acts as a reference for cable placement.
- Mark Cable Positions: For wire mesh trays, mark lines across the tray width at intervals corresponding to cable spacing (typically 150-230 mm or 6-9 inches) to guide cable placement and prevent overcrowding .
- Check Minimum Bend Radius: Ensure the bend radius is at least the manufacturer-recommended minimum for the cable type. For most power and control cables, the radius should be 6-10 times the cable diameter .
