Pigtail vs. Patch Cord

While pigtails and patch cords may look similar, they serve different purposes:

- Pigtail: Connector on one end, bare fiber on the other; used for splicing into bulk fiber cables.
- Patch Cord: Connectors on both ends; used to connect two already-terminated devices or equipment . Patch cords can even be cut in half to create two pigtails, but pigtails are specifically designed for field splicing and permanent connections.
