

Precautions for pulling optical cables



Overview

Use pulling grips with swivel to attach to the pull rope, lubricants compatible with cable jacket and duct material to achieve maximum pulling distance. Optical fiber cables are designed for particular twisting/torsion. Doing so can result in higher bending losses and/or internal breaks in the fiber. Generally the bending radius of a cable is greater than $20D$, where D is the cable diameter.
