Overview

Upgrade the Material Specification: Do not procure standard hot-dip galvanized (HDG) tray for ammonia zones. Instead, specify: - Heavy-Duty Galvanizing: Require a thicker zinc coating (e., G235 per ASTM A123) for increased sacrificial mass. Is the steel galvanized before welding, or after the tray is fully fabricated?
