Work areas should be kept clean, and fiber scraps should be collected in sealed, designated disposal containers to avoid accidental exposure ().

Optical Hazards

Fiber optics transmit laser light, which can be invisible yet harmful to the retina. Even low-power lasers can cause permanent eye damage if viewed directly. Technicians should never look into a fiber line and instead use optical power meters or visual fault locators to check signal presence safely (). Awareness of active fibers and proper labeling is critical to prevent accidental exposure ().
