

Safety Protection Measures for Optical Cable Lines

Protecting optical cable lines requires a combination of physical, environmental, and electrical safeguards to ensure long-term performance and reliability.

Environmental and Physical Protection

Outdoor fiber optic cables face threats such as UV exposure, temperature extremes, moisture, wind, ice, rodent damage, crushing, soil shifting, and accidental digging . To mitigate these risks:

- **UV-Resistant Jackets:** Use polyethylene (PE) or low-smoke zero-halogen (LSZH) jackets to prevent sunlight degradation .
- **Water-Blocking Materials:** Incorporate gel or tape inside the cable to prevent moisture ingress .
- **Metal or Non-Metallic Armoring:** Provides resistance against crushing, rodent attacks, and mechanical impact .
- **Cable Conduits:** PVC, HDPE, or steel conduits protect cables from physical impact, dust, and moisture, and can be buried or mounted above ground .
- **Cable Trays and Padding:** Support and protect cables in industrial or exposed environments, with padding materials like foam or rubber to reduce stress .
- **Cable Protection Caps:** Cover exposed cable ends to prevent dust and moisture contamination .
