A core switch is the backbone of a large-scale network, designed to handle massive volumes of traffic with ultra-low latency and maximum reliability. Engineered to aggregate massive volumes of data from distribution switches, it provides ultra-low latency and maximum throughput to ensure uninterrupted routing and packet. An edge switch primarily operates at the data link layer (Layer 2) and the network layer (Layer 3) of the Open Systems Interconnection (OSI) model. Scalability: They can handle a large number of connections and adapt to growing network demands. Redundancy: Many core switch.
