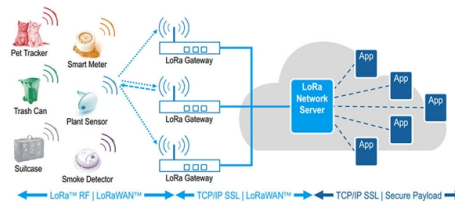


Shared ground wire for distribution box



Overview

26 mm 2 (10 AWG) ground wire must be used, and in all other markets a 6 mm 2 must be used. Power from factory ground must be installed by a qualified electrician. Grounding of the units: Attach a ground wire from one of. When you have two switches in one box, both devices need to be grounded, and the box itself may also require a ground connection depending on whether it is metal or plastic. A metal box must be grounded because the enclosure itself becomes part of the fault path if insulation fails on any conductor. Residential wiring utilizes a three-wire system consisting of a “hot” wire that delivers power, a “neutral” wire that provides the normal return path, and a “ground” wire dedicated solely to safety. I can. Additional rules for the grounding and bonding of industrial control panels include the sizing of ground conductors and the conditions that dictate when power supplies and transformers must be grounded.
