

Two wires in the secondary distribution box



Summary of Content

In a secondary distribution box (subpanel), connect the live (phase) wires to the circuit breakers, the neutral wires to the neutral busbar, and the ground wires to the ground busbar, keeping neutral and ground separate.

Live (Phase) Wires

The incoming live wires, also called phase or hot wires, should be connected to the line terminals of the circuit breakers in the secondary distribution box. Each breaker controls a specific circuit, and the live wire provides the primary electrical energy to that circuit. For single-phase circuits, a single-pole breaker (1P) is used, while for circuits requiring both live and neutral disconnection, a double-pole breaker (2P) is used. Wire colors typically follow standard coding: yellow for phase A, green for phase B, and red for phase C.

Neutral Wires

Neutral wires should be connected to the neutral busbar inside the distribution box. In a subpanel, the neutral busbar must not be bonded to the ground busbar; this separation prevents unwanted current flow through the grounding system and complies with NEC regulations. For single-pole breakers, the neutral bypasses the breaker and connects directly to the neutral busbar, while for double-pole breakers, the neutral is connected to the breaker according to its markings.
