

Viewing Port Information on a Fiber Optic Switch



Summary of Content

You can view Fibre Channel switch ports and their associated WWNs using either the switch's graphical interface or CLI commands, which display port status, speed, and connected device information.

Using a Graphical Interface

Most Fibre Channel switches provide a graphical or table view of ports:

- Navigate to the Fibre Channel switch tile in the management interface.
- Click Ports to display all ports in either Table or Graph view.
- Each port entry typically shows:
 - Port ID and status (online/offline)
 - Speed (automatic negotiation or fixed Gbps)
 - Connected device WWN (World Wide Name of initiators or targets)
 - Connected host IP and controller port ID
 - Storage serial number and subscriber ID if applicable
- Clicking a port provides detailed information about the connected device and its WWN .
