

What is a downward bend in a cable tray called

The downward bend at the bottom of a cable tray is commonly called a "vertical outside bend" or "outside vertical elbow," and may also involve a "dropout" for cable exit.

Definition and Function

A vertical outside bend (also referred to as an outside vertical elbow) is a cable tray fitting that changes the tray's direction from a horizontal plane downward to a lower elevation, allowing cables to descend safely from overhead trays to floor-mounted equipment or between floors . This bend ensures that cables maintain a proper bend radius, preventing damage to insulation and reducing stress on the cables . A dropout is an accessory often used in conjunction with the downward bend. It provides a controlled exit point for cables to leave the tray vertically, maintaining the correct bend radius and preventing sharp turns or pinching .

Typical Applications

- Routing cables from ceiling-mounted trays to floor-level equipment
- Connecting overhead cable runs to machinery or panels
- Descending between floors in multi-story buildings
- Ensuring compliance with cable bend radius requirements to avoid insulation damage and signal degradation
