

# What to do if your home's electrical distribution box is leaking air



## Overview

Stopping air leakage requires a two-pronged approach that seals both the faceplate and the junction box within the wall cavity. Once the power is confirmed off using a non-contact voltage tester, remove the. Cold air in winter and hot, humid air in summer can infiltrate through these gaps, forcing your HVAC system to work harder, increasing energy consumption, and ultimately driving up your utility bills. By addressing these easily fixable leaks, you not only save money but also enhance your home's. The air leaking through your electrical outlets is air that was drawn in somewhere else in the building envelope — typically through large holes in the attic or other hidden locations. This phenomenon is known as the “stack effect” or “chimney effect. When performing energy audits and building investigations in my very cold climate, I rarely see a house that doesn't have some air leaking around electrical boxes installed in exterior. With the right materials and techniques, you can effectively air-seal electrical boxes and minimize air leakage. Air leaks from these areas can significantly drive up heating and cooling.
